LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS NO.2 OF 2010

WATER SKIING IN LANGSTONE HARBOUR

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Water Skiing is permitted from sunrise to sunset in Langstone Harbour from 1 April to 31 October 2010 within the following limits.

An area covering the southern and central parts of the Langstone Channel to the east of Sword Point and marked by YELLOW spherical buoys in the following charted positions:

1(S)	50° 48.20'N	01° 01.25'W
2(SW)	50° 48.45'N	01° 01.60'W
3(E)	50° 48.82'N	00° 59.80'W
4(W)	50° 48.95'N	01° 00.40'W
5(NE)	50° 49.53'N	00° 59.60'W
6(NW)	50° 49.53'N	01° 00.20'W

Water skiing may only be carried out under licence issued by the Langstone Harbour Board. Permission to Water Ski in this area does not confer the exclusive use of these waters upon Water Skiers – the area remains open to all users. Licences will only be issued for vessels covered by Third Party Insurance. Licences for 2010 are issued in the form of an adhesive plaque bearing a large black number against a white background. Vessels may not engage in water skiing unless the licence number is attached to the towing vessel. The Water Ski circuit is anti-clockwise at all times, Mid-channel being the dividing line for the circuit. The Harbour speed limit of 10 knots applies to all areas of the Harbour and may only be exceeded in the Water Ski area by licensed vessels actually towing skiers. Using or landing on the Islands and the Admiralty Raft is not permitted.

DEEP DRAFT VESSELS use the Water Ski area. These vessels are confined to the deep-water channel and have priority over other vessels. The International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea and the Langstone Harbour Byelaws must be observed at all times.
