

How to contribute:

Take a photograph of an animal or plant in Langstone Harbour. Attach your photograph to an e-mail and send it to: ark@langstoneharbour.org.uk

Attachments must have a total of less than 9MB per e-mail.

Don't forget to tell us where in the harbour the picture was taken, and also your name if you would like it included on the site.

If your image is chosen for the Langstone Ark, the Langstone Harbour Board's Environment Officer will create a web page including your photograph and some information about the animal or plant. You can search for your photograph, or browse through the photographs contributed by others on the Langstone Ark page of the Langstone Harbour Board website.

Rules:

1. All photographs must be taken in Langstone Harbour. The boundary for the Langstone Ark project extends 20m inland from the high tide mark, with Farlington Marshes also being included.
2. The Langstone Harbour Board's Environment Officer will have complete discretion in the selection of images for the Langstone Ark, and all images will be contributed free of charge.
3. Only photographs of harbour wildlife, submitted in digital format, can be accepted for the Langstone Ark project. Please do not send hard copies.

Tips:

As the Langstone Ark project aims to collect images of all the species in the harbour, a picture of a Black Headed Gull or a Common Shore Crab is just as welcome and likely to be included in the Langstone Ark as a Spoonbill or a Seahorse.

Since the Langstone Ark aims to create a digital record of wildlife in the harbour, images consisting of a blurry dot in the distance are unlikely to be included no matter how unusual the pictured species may be.

You don't need an expensive camera to be part of the Langstone Ark project—even images submitted on a mobile phone can be submitted!
