COVID-19: GUIDANCE ON BOATING

DEFRA's 'Guidance on Inland and Coastal Boating and protecting yourself and others from coronavirus' is to be withdrawn on 4 July.

From 4 July there will be no specific restrictions on charter and passenger boat operations, and overnight stays on boats will be permitted.

Individuals and boating operators are still responsible for conducting a risk assessment drawing on the relevant sources of government guidance on COVID-19 shown below to achieve safe physical distancing and proper hygiene.
